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Abstract

The study of representation as a translating and hermeneutic procedure set in central position the "visual" passing the neutral images of documents and archive recording. The usage of visual media and the study of visual systems as mediums of research and discourse producing brings fore the relations between technique and community. The representational nature of artifacts guides to study them as social objects that have active role in social life.
