Implementation Instructions: (3)	The exams are held remotely and it is necessary for the students to connect to Microsoft Teams on the one hand (by selecting the relevant link), and on the other hand to E-class , in the course entitled: " T107 : Dance, Culture & Society: A timeless overview". Candidates must log in through their institutional account. In Microsoft Teams, there will be a data check - identification. After completing the identification, the written exam will follow in the e-class, which will last 120 minutes. Students are asked to give answers in critical questions.

- (2) Note down the evaluation methods used by the teacher, e.g.
